

## ***Why are the examples of Technical Writing so old?***

Are developments from the 80's really that Old? Ancient is more like it from some people's perspectives. Actually, there is a very simple explanation.

All of the Technical Writing Examples presented on this web site are "**publicly available**" documents, all published in various symposium proceedings, or by the U.S. Government in the case of the Patent. There were several such documents that we could have also used from the 1990's, but space mandated limitations. The purpose of providing these examples is to present illustrations of what was written and presented, not an exhaustive library of everything written for public consumption.

Easily 95% of the technical writing developed has been project and/or contract related, and all of it is considered company proprietary information from our perspective. Having said that, we have shadow-written papers that have been published (usually under a Program Manager's name) and presented publicly about products that we have developed or helped to develop. Since they paid for these efforts, they own them, and we consider them the private property of the contracting company.
